Dozens of vendors will be selling a plethora of merchandise and products including such items as candles, jewelry, antiques and collectibles, honey, dolls, bird houses and fountains, creative crosses, knives, buckles and purses, and a huge selection of western décor and much more. It's different and new each month!

There's still room for more vendors to participate. And when we say vendors we mean everyone -- commercial businesses, ranch and individual entrepreneurs, flea marketers, garage sellers, as well as arts and crafts masters.
